

Procedure for the Colloquium for the Master Practitioner Certification in Logosynthesis®

The colloquium in the form of a collegial discussion is an oral examination at the end of the Master Practitioner in Logosynthesis® course.

1. Preparation for the colloquium

The candidate prepares an assessment in electronic form (5000-7000 words) on the basic attitude of Logosynthesis, his/her personal development process and the deepening of his/her theoretical knowledge and practical skills in Logosynthesis at the Master Practitioner level. The candidate presents a critical reflection of his/her experiences and justifies their learning steps in a comprehensible way from the Logosynthesis perspective. They submit this assessment to the LIA. Subsequently, the LIA organizes the colloquium according to the training manual.

2. Process of the colloquium

Task

- In the colloquium, the candidate discusses his/her development during the Master Practitioner course. The development process is reflected in the colloquium with two experts.
- The candidate demonstrates his/her basic attitude, his/her theoretical knowledge and practical skills in the application of Logosynthesis.
- The candidate is able to reflect on the process of the working relationship with clients at the Master Practitioner level.
- The candidate is able to apply concepts and methods acquired from literature to his/her work.

Process criteria

Ability to reflect: The candidate is able to reflect on his/her own process during the colloquium at the Master Practitioner level and address any disturbances.

Communication skills: The candidate communicates congruently, actively and consciously in discussion with the experts. His/her statements are understandable.

Flexibility: The candidate will respond appropriately and flexibly to the questions and statements from the experts.

Task focus: The candidate is co-responsible for focusing the process on the tasks of the colloquium.



Content criteria

Mission: The candidate is able to name and reflect on his/her life task and the importance of Logosynthesis in dealing with this task.

Understanding the Principles of Logosynthesis: the candidate is able to comprehend and explain the principles of Logosynthesis at the Master Practitioner level, with the use of literature.

Application of Logosynthesis: the candidate knows the range of methods in Logosynthesis and can integrate them into his/her practical work and reflect on the experiences made with them.

Basic Attitude of Logosynthesis: the candidate can describe the basic attitude of Logosynthesis. He/she will discuss how to carry out his/her professional activity on this basis, taking into account the ethical aspects.

3. Organisation of the colloquium

Persons involved

Two experts / MPL Candidate

Date and place

The colloquium takes place once a year, immediately before or after the Summer Conference. Alternatively, it can be held via video conference within 3 months after registration for the Summer Conference.

Procedure and duration

- The colloquium lasts 60 minutes and is recorded. An expert will attend to the technical requirements and the recording. The recording will be kept until the certification process has been completed.
- An expert moderates the colloquium, monitors the time and represents the LIA.
- The experts discuss with the candidate within the framework of the tasks of the colloquium.
- After the colloquium, the experts discuss the results. The moderator forwards it to LIA.
- The candidate will be informed of the result in writing within 2 weeks and provided with reasons for the result.
- If the candidate has passed the examination, he/she will become certified as a Master Practitioner in Logosynthesis®.
- If the result is unsatisfactory, the candidate may appeal to the LIA Presidium within 30 days after receiving written information about the result.
- The candidate can repeat the examination after a minimum period of 4 months.
